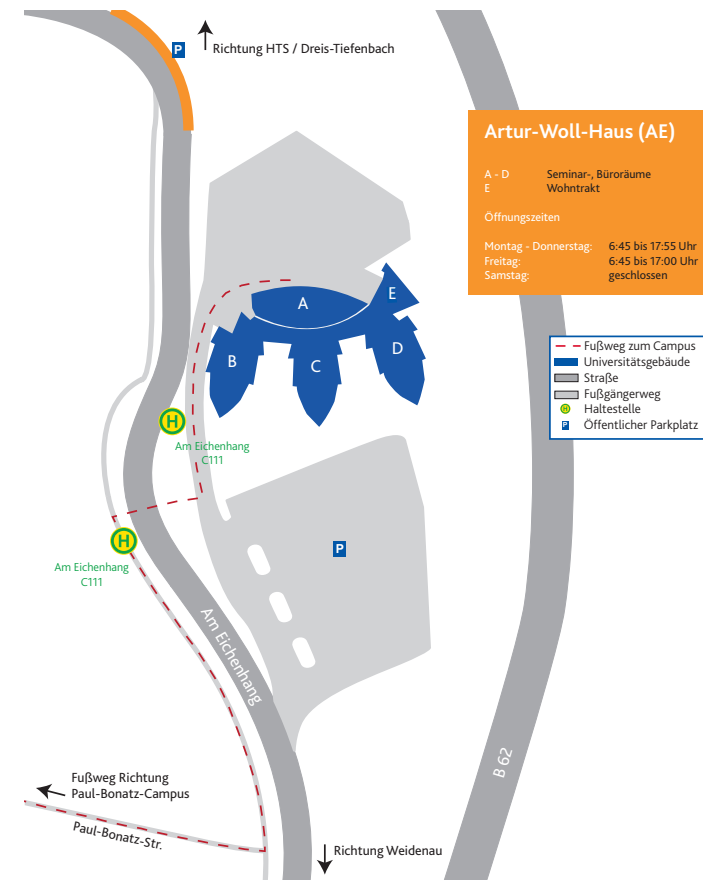
Friederike Welter, Univ.-Prof. Dr. Universität Siegen

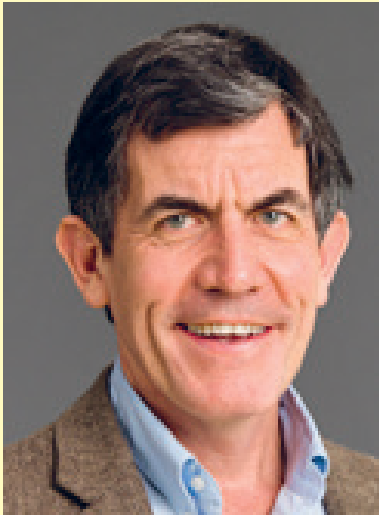

is the George F. Farris Professor of Entrepreneurship at Rutgers University, where he heads the Rutgers Advanced Institute for the Study of Entrepreneurship and Development.

His research focuses on entrepreneurship under resource constraints, including brico-lage and improvisation and on the social psychology of founder identity. He is a Senior Fellow of the Bertha Centre for Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship at the University of Cape Town GSB, and serves as Field Editor (sociology) for Journal of Business Venturing and Associate Editor for Strategic Entrepreneurship Journal.

William Gartner, Ph.D.

holds a joint appointment with Copenhagen Business School (as Professor of Entrepreneurship and the Art of Innovation) and California Lutheran University (as Professor of Entrepreneurship).

He is the 2005 winner of the Swedish Entrepreneurship Foundation International Award for outstanding contributions to entrepreneurship and small business research. The book Entrepreneurship as Organizing: Selected Works of William B. Gartner will be published this summer by Edward Elgar. His current scholarship focuses on entrepreneurial behavior, the rhetoric of entrepreneurial practice, opportunity design, and the hermeneutics of possibility and failure.
